

Anyone 18 or older is welcome to attend. The book for discussion will be *The Gown: a Novel of the Royal Wedding* by Jennifer Robson. There are plenty of copies of this book in our county library system, so reserve your copy at your earliest convenience. About *The Gown:* in the recovery of post-World War 2 London, Princess Elizabeth's wedding is a bright spot. Two skilled embroiderers have been chosen to create the wedding dress: Ann, a native Londoner with a long history of dress design, and Miriam, a refugee from France with secrets to hide. Nearly seven decades later, Ann's granddaughter discovers an heirloom that leads her to London to trace the history of both of these talented artists.

The second meeting will be held on Wed., Feb. 12, 2020 at 4:45. We are hoping that by alternating days and times, we are making it convenient for more people to attend.

In post apolyptic Chicago, citizens are divided into one of five factions. At age 16, young people are expected to choose the faction in which they will spend the rest of their lives. Beatrice Prior is a "divergent" – a person who fits into multiple factions – which is a very dangerous position to be in. While keeping her secret, Beatrice joins the Dauntless faction and meets Four, one of its trainers. Beatrice and Four must join forces to prevent further chaos from occurring in an already dystopian world. This book was also made into a film starring Shailene Woodley and Theo James.



Many folks are wondering if Food for Fines is returning. It is – with some changes. Food for Fines will now be happening on specified months throughout the year. First month is February. We are also changing the procedure in order to better benefit the recipients and get items that are truly needed.

Here are the February requests:

Bottle of Laundry Detergent (for the shelter) – those bringing a regular-sized bottle of detergent (not travel sized) will receive \$5 off their fine total (Columbia items only, please)

Can Openers (manual) for the Food Bank – those bringing **two** can openers will receive \$5.00 off their fine total (\$2.50 per can opener)



















Pillows (for the shelter) – those bringing a bed pillow for the shelter will receive \$3.00 off their fine total. Pillows must be NEW, in their original packaging.

We cannot issue credits on accounts for future fines – nor can we accept items as payment for LOST or DAMAGED materials. This program is only valid for COLUMBIA materials – thank you!
